Interest-Based Nervous System of ADHDers

The attention *deficit* that ADHDers have is greatly misunderstood. There is no actual deficit, but rather a poorly understood neurotype trait that moves people toward their interests and away from understimulating situations. In our training, you'll learn the ins and outs of this trait, its evolution, its

interplay with the nervous system, how being Autistic can influence this trait, and Dr. Dodson's ICNU framework to improve motivation and focus issues. You'll also gain valuable information about the pros and cons of medication to properly assess if a client may need a referral for medication management or if applying the ICNU framework is sufficient. There will be approximately 30 minutes of workshop time where you will learn to apply the ICNU framework to hypothetical clients and gain valuable insights on how this framework can benefit them.
